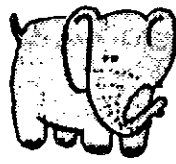

Speidel, 2 Others to Get MU Honors

Three men—the director of the Milwaukee County Zoo, a noted author and playwright, and a historian — will be awarded honorary degrees at Marquette University's commencement May 18.

Father John P. Raynor, president of Marquette, announced the names of the recipients Wednesday.

They are George Speidel, director of the zoo here since 1947; Eric Voegelin, the Henry Salvatori Distinguished Scholar at Stanford University's Institution on War, Revolution and Peace, and Elie Wiesel, an author and professor of Jewish Studies at City College in New York.

Marquette's commencement will be held in the Arena at 2 p.m. May 18. More than 1,500 persons will receive degrees at the ceremony.

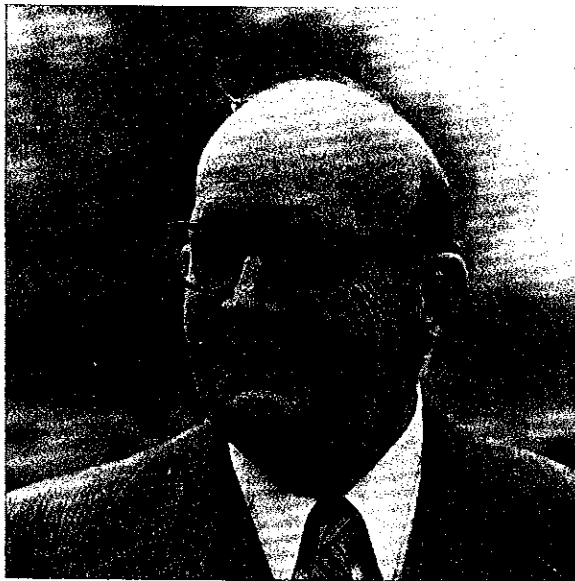
Speidel, 63, will be awarded the honorary doctor of science degree. He has served as consultant to groups planning zoo construction around the country and is a research associate at the University of Wisconsin—Milwaukee.

Voegelin, 74, a native of Cologne, Germany, will receive the honorary doctor of letters degree. He taught at Vienna, Harvard, Bennington (Vt.) College, the University of Ala-

bama, Louisiana State University and the University of Munich before going to Stanford in 1969. Some scholars have compared his work to that of historian Arnold Toynbee.

Wiesel, 46, is a native of Sighet, Romania.

He will receive the honorary doctor of letters degree. Wiesel is a survivor of Nazi concentration camps in Auschwitz and Buchenwald and some of his writing is based on his experiences there. His works include "The Jews of Silence," "A Beggar in Jerusalem," "Souls on Fire," and the play, "Zalmen, of the Madness of God."

ZOO PRIDE is the name of the volunteer organization, which was formed, when some 80 of our Zoological members made their 1975 New Year's Resolution to give of their time and talents. Now we would like to encourage more of you to become a part of our group, joining in the fun and satisfaction of helping in a small, but important way to keep our terrific Zoo Number 1 in the nation.

Let me tell you a little bit about our activities in the past months. We chose a name -- ZOO PRIDE. We elected officers: Rose Mary O'Byrne is our President, Sybil La Budde, our Vice President, Mildred Gaul Treasurer, Charlotte Teweles, Recording Secretary and Julie Borges, Corresponding Secretary.

Our September and November meetings hold still more "extra specials" for the members of the ZOO PRIDE.
